APRIL BRING TO SHARE

At our April and September meetings, members are invited to bring in gardening related (or something you just really think is neat) items to show and share with fellow NWHS members. This is not a competition—there is no judging involved. The action happens at the fireplace end of the room. Tables are set out with signs suggesting general organization of the exhibits. As you arrive with something to share, check in at the central table to get a slip for each of your exhibit(s). As you do this, you will also be entered in the draw for one of three \$5 participation draws. Each exhibit slip has space for others to write down comments. This is the other half of the sharing—please give feedback to those who brought in things for you to view. Thanks

Suggestions of Exhibits: These are the table signs. Do any bring to mind something you have experienced?—bring it in! You can bring in any number of exhibits.

- **Garden Glory:** Beautiful or unusual plants, blooms or foliage from your garden
- **Photos:** Garden related, including the Snow's Shock & Awe
- **Great Tips:** Can be from a book or magazine—or even a book or magazine that you recommend
- **Garden Design:** Info or questions—or even plans of your future intentions

- **Plant Identification:** Bring in the plant, or a leaf, or a photo
- **Insects:** Please keep specimens contained
- **Weeds & Disease:** Please keep infected materials enclosed in plastic
- **Other:** Anything that doesn't fit in the other categories

PLANT SALE NOT FAR OFF

The Fund Raising Committee is busy ramping up for the Boulevard Plant Sale--Saturday, May 13. You'll be hearing that date over and over, so even if you forget to put it on your calendar, it will be inextricably lodged in your brain! Like an "earworm".

The sale is our chief fund-raiser so we're keen for it to be really successful—which equates to lots of good plants for lots of customers. We're not aiming to repeat the huge sale of eons ago but to produce a more intimate neighbourhood sale. Of course, persons from outside the neighbourhood are welcome to come to purchase. We plan to have 6-8 tables of healthy plant material--all member-provided, grown from seed (usually vegetables & annuals) or divided from their own garden treasures.

Of course monetary results are directly related to member-input. More input, more results. With just two months before the sale, now is the time to start your veggie and annual seed-sowing. Why not combine your post-snow yard clean-up with your plant sale potting-up? Please tell Janet or Annemarie (see the contact listing) what varieties you are growing so we'll have the information ready for our customers. At the sale we will have resource books (and, of course, internet access) for our volunteers but by having the information in advance simplifies and speeds things up. Tonight and at the April meeting, there will be a clip-board passed around for you to list those plants that you plan to donate.

If you have extra 4", 1 gal or 2 gal nursery pots, let us know. We'll direct people to you. Alternately, bring them to the Plant Sale tables at the April meeting. The sale table is also where you will find the venetian blind tags for creating labels for your plants.

By our April Club Meeting, we'll have material for you to post in public spots, and suggestions of where post. The sale should be highlighted on the club Facebook page by then (yes, we do have a Facebook page!). Hopefully Steve Whysall will add our sale to his column in the Vancouver Sun. We plan a repeat of our success with Sheryl McKay of CBC's North by Northwest. Last year a couple of members let her know about it and she announced it twice during her broadcast. Any other ideas for publicity?

ROAMING THE ROOM: THE FOYER

The Free Table: This is, not surprisingly, a table where you can pick up free stuff. When Seed Exchange seeds are available for pick-up, you will find them here. Good place to find magazines. Got something just too good to toss? You are welcome to add it on the table. Please package so dirt is not spread about. Remember, if your items have reasonable monetary value, the At-Meeting Sale Table (near the fireplace) would be a better destination. If your donation is still on the table at the meeting end, it is expected that you will take it back home.

Name tags: Please wear your name tag. We are a social club and nothing facilitates interaction better than knowing the name of the person you with whom you are talking. If you don't find it in front of your name in the box, it is probably because you took it home with you. If you have done that on purpose, please leave a note saying so. It is frustrating for the person organizing the tags to find empty slots—is it lost? —is a replacement needed? Creating new tags time-intensive and often an unnecessary expense. At meeting end, just drop your tag in the open shoe box provided. Thanks.

Sign-in sheet: Right next to the name tags. Members and guests are expected to sign-in. Not only does this give us a list of who attended, it also gives an indication of what topics were of interest to the membership—or, looking at it another way, what topics were not of interest.

Newsletter & other bulk hand-outs: Pick up this month's newsletter here. Also available will be things such as past newsletters, contest & show handouts, Florissa flyers and catalogues.
